WHAT'S NEW

The RM would like to welcome Blaine Zentner as Councillor for Division 1, Dawson Buhs who has joined our team for a second year as our summer student and Dylan Ehlert who has returned to the RM maintenance team!

Weather permitting, the RM intends to clay cap 2 miles of Rge Rd 2212 from Twp Rd 352 to 354, 1.5 miles of Rge Rd 2201 from Twp Rd 354.5 to 360 and 1 mile of Rge Rd 2220 from Twp Rd 365 to 370. The RM will be hiring a contractor for the Rge Rd 2212 project so our maintenance team can focus on the other projects. Road grinding is planned if time and weather conditions allow. Please watch for road closed/construction notices posted on our Facebook page and be mindful of the workers.

New for 2026 the RM of LeRoy offered MG30 as dust control to ratepayers. If you are interested in purchasing for 2027 or have questions, please contact the office.

Equipment upgrades for this year included a 2025 XH1500 Schulte Mower.

In 2024-2025 BHP funded the upgrade of Twp Rd 342A from Rge Rd 2201 to Rge Rd 2203 (Road 2) to primary weight. Project cost was \$6,578,455.00.

PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT OPTIONS

Property taxes are due on or before Dec. 31st. Taxes remaining unpaid after this will be charged 1% penalty per month. The RM accepts cash, cheque, online payments (check with your banking institution) and e-transfer.

DID YOU KNOW

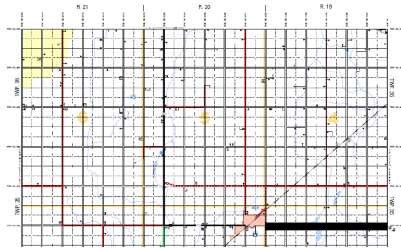
DID YOU KNOW: The Council of the RM of LeRoy, No. 339 (RM) passed Bylaw 2025-03 December 10th, 2025 to Manage Vehicle Weights to reduce the risk of our producers being ticketed for overweight loads.

DID YOU KNOW: Public Roads Managed by the RM are restricted to secondary weights unless permitted in Bylaw 2025-03;

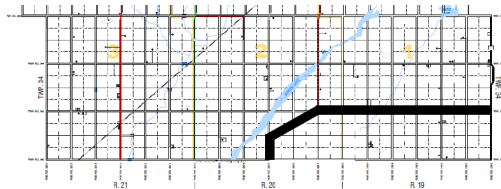
DID YOU KNOW: Any Permit issued by the Administrator or their designate does not imply permission to the hauler to haul over any part of the Saskatchewan Highway Network or Public Highways (any road) not under the direct control or Administration of the RM.

DID YOU KNOW: Any permit issued by the RM may be issued as a single load, a single trip with multiple loads or an annual permit.

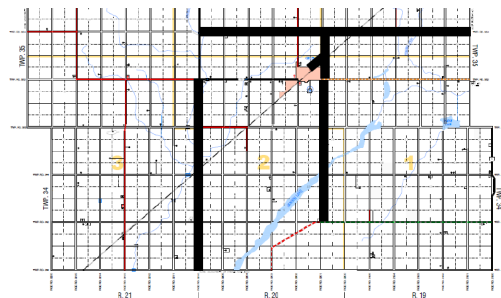
DID YOU KNOW: Vehicles travelling Township Road 352 (8 mile) from Range Road 2200 to Range Road 2190 are limited to eight (8) tonnes (8,000 kg or 17,600 pounds). Shown below.



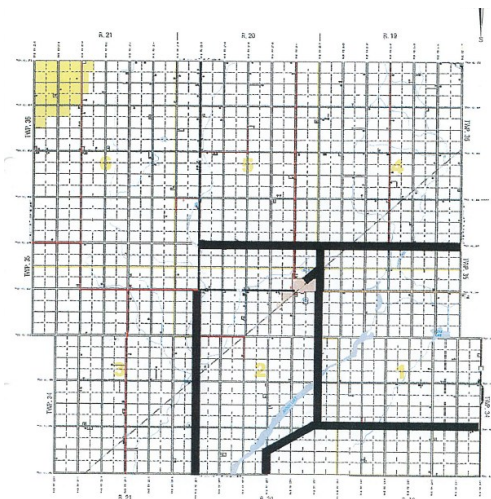
DID YOU KNOW: The RM has Designated Routes for Primary Weights on Township Road 342 from Range Road 2190 to Range Road 2201 (Road 1) and Township Road 342A from Range Road 2201 to Township Road 340 (Road 2) that are not subject to spring road bans. Shown below.



DID YOU KNOW: The RM has Primary Weight Corridors that are subject to spring road bans. Shown below.



DID YOU KNOW: If you need to operate a vehicle with a gross weight or load greater than secondary weight on roads not part of the Primary Weight Corridors (shown below) you require a permit from the RM. A permit may be issued at no charge for a single load, a single trip with multiple loads or an annual permit.



PUSHING SNOW ACROSS MUNICIPAL ROADS

Council has requested ratepayers refrain from pushing snow from their private properties across and/or onto municipal roads. Snow ridges and snow piles are dangerous to the grader operators and to the travelling public.

RM RIGHT OF WAY



The RM would like to remind landowners that they are liable for any unauthorized work within the right of way. Landowners must obtain permission from the municipality prior to any works being done within the right of way.

SETBACKS

The RM has Bylaws providing minimum setbacks of buildings, including dwellings, signs, trees, fences, stone placement, earth or gravel piles, portable structures, dugouts and machinery or other similar objects:

- 45 meters (150 feet) from the centerline of a municipal road allowance, grid road, main farm access road; and
- 90 meters (295 feet) within the intersection of the center line is required

On provincial Highways minimum setbacks are regulated by the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure. If you are looking to place something along a provincial highway, an approved Roadside Development Permit must be obtained from them.

Remember we are here to help! Don't hesitate to reach out to the office to discuss setbacks or ask if you require a permit in advance of your project. This will help landowners avoid incurring costs that might otherwise be avoided.

PEST AND WEED CONTROL

Appreciation is extended to Tenie Schoettler for her years of service as the Pest Control Officer. Brian Poncelet has been appointed Pest Control Officer for the municipality under the authority of *The Pest Control Act*. Ratepayers are asked to be diligent in inspecting and baiting.

Please contact the RM office if Pest Control Services are required.



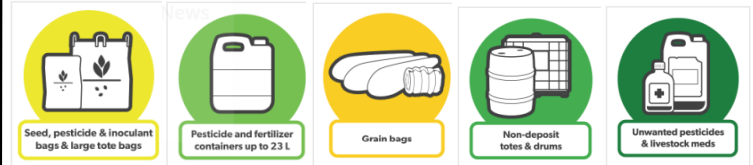

GRAIN BAG & CONTAINER DISPOSAL

At times grain bags and chemical containers have been left unattended, resulting in a nuisance and untidy appearance for adjacent landowners and the travelling public. Producers are reminded to voluntarily clean up discarded grain bags, chemical and fertilizer jugs, totes and drums.

FIRE INSURANCE COVERAGE

Any person who starts a fire is responsible for all fire-fighting costs and possible liability from damage caused by the fire. Review your insurance with your insurance company to ensure you have adequate coverage. If you do decide to burn, choose to do so under conditions that minimize health and safety risks and call the Controlled Burn Services prior to starting the fire.

PROVINCIAL DISASTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The RM of LeRoy's request for designation as an eligible assistance area under the Provincial Disaster Assistance Program (PDAP) for the flooding event May 1-4th, 2026 was approved.
